# PE and Sports Funding

From September 2013, the government allocated £450 million on improving physical education (PE) and sport in primary schools. Over the 3 academic years 2013 to 2014, 2014 to 2015 and 2015 to 2016, this extra funding is allocated directly to primary schools.

Schools receive PE and Sport Premium funding based on the number of pupils in Years 1 to 6. In most cases, the amount received is determined by how many pupils at the Academy attract the funding using data from the January 2014 school census.

Schools must spend the funding to improve the quality of the PE and sport activities they offer their pupils but they are free to choose the best way of using the money.

For example, you can use your funding to:

- > hire specialist PE teachers
- > hire qualified sports coaches to work with teachers
- > provide existing staff with teaching resources to help them teach PE and sport
- > support and involve the least active children by running or extending school sports clubs, holiday clubs and Change4Life clubs
- > run sport competitions or increase pupils' participation in the School Games
- > run sports activities with other schools.

The P.E Coordinator, Mayflower Academy Leadership Team and Governors evaluate Pupil Premium and PE & Sports Funding spending and the impact upon attainment and progress of pupils.

The document below shows how Mayflower Community Academy plans on spending their allocated funds of £9800 the Academic Year 2015-16.

### £8825

- Aim: To continue to improve the standard of teaching and learning in P.E across the Academy.
- MAP Sports partnership this money will pay for
   qualified sports teachers
   from Marine Academy
   Plymouth to work
   alongside MCA staff
   developing their ability to
   teach P.E further. The MAP
   staff will also run playtime
   interventions for targetted
   groups of children.
- Outcome: An even higher standard of teaching will ensure children make outstanding progress in P.E

### £250

- Aim: To develop specialist
   P.E knowledge of FMS across the teaching staff
- Fundamental Movement Skills INSET session for teachers to enable them to feel more confident and resourced to teach FMS lessons. Session to be led by a lead FMS facilitator.
- Outcome: All staff will feel more confident and will be more effective when delivering FMS sessions.

### £450

- Aim: To ensure that the Academy staff have access to the highest quality equipment.
- P.E equipment and resources to be updated and bought to ensure that P.E and an active lifestyle become embedded across the Academy.
- Outcome: Children and staff will have access to all necessary resouces and equipment to enable high quality Physical Education to take place.

## £325

- Aim: To give children a taster of sports other than those they would routinely be taught in school.
- Children within the Academy will be able to take part in taster session for sports that may be outside of their normal experiences. The hope is that this will broaden their horizons and encourage them to take up sport and lead a healthy lifestyle.
- Outcome: Targetted children/year groups from across the Academy will have experienced a range of sports outside the norm and changed/improved their feelings towards physical activity.
