At Mayflower Academy, Physical Education, Physical Literacy and enjoyment in sport is fundamental in every child's development. Standards are continuing to rise and this is supported by the Government's introduction of the PE Pupil Premium. The information below can be found at

The government is providing additional funding of £150 million per annum for academic years 2013 to 2014 and 2014 to 2015 to improve provision of physical education (PE) and sport in primary schools. This funding - provided jointly by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport - will be allocated to primary school Head Teachers. This funding is ring-fenced and therefore can only be spent on provision of PE and sport in schools and has, on 6th February 2014, been guaranteed until 2020. Purpose of funding:

Schools must spend the additional funding on improving their provision of PE and sport, but they will have the freedom to choose how they do this.

Possible uses for the funding might include:

- hiring specialist PE teachers or qualified sports coaches to work with primary teachers when teaching PE
- supporting and engaging the least active children through new or additional Change4Life clubs
- paying for professional development opportunities for teachers in PE and sport
- providing cover to release primary teachers for professional development in PE and sport
- running sport competitions, or increasing pupils' participation in the School Games
- buying quality assured professional development modules or materials for PE and sport

- providing places for pupils on after school sports clubs and holiday clubs
- pooling the additional funding with that of other local schools.

Accountability

From September 2013, schools will be held to account over how they spend their additional, ring-fenced funding. Ofsted will strengthen the coverage of PE and sport within the 'Inspectors' handbook' and supporting guidance so that both schools and inspectors know how sport and PE will be assessed in future as part of the school's overall provision.

One year on, Ofsted will carry out a survey reporting on the first year's expenditure of additional funding and its impact.

Schools will also be required to include details of their provision of PE and sport on their website, alongside details of their broader curriculum, so that parents can compare sports provision between schools, both within and beyond the school day.

Here at Mayflower we have used our money to gain the maximum possible effect so to have the biggest influence on our children's lives. So that every child has use of this money we have done the following to ensure PE is embedded into life at Mayflower

- Joined the MAP (Marine Academy Plymouth) Partnership, to share resources, enter competitions and festivals, provide staff with continuing professional development and build relationships with local schools
- Employed Stephen Coles for 15 hours per week from January 2014 to offer extended opportunities for all children in competitive events and internal school competition. To run a Year 6 Sports Leaders initiative and promote positive role-models and run Parents in PE groups to promote enjoyment in sport and physical activity not only at Mayflower but in the wider community
- Our PE Pupil Premium covers 4 specific areas - Staff Development, Curriculum Development, Healthy Lifestyles and Participation and Competition. Definitions of these areas, our targets and how we will measure and ensure progress can be found on our PE Rationale and PE Pupil Premium Action Plan
