At Mayflower Academy, Physical Education, Physical Literacy and enjoyment in sport is fundamental in every child's development. Standards are continuing to rise and this is supported by the Government's introduction of the PE Pupil Premium. The information below can be found at

The government is providing additional funding of £150 million per annum for academic years 2013 to 2014 and 2014 to 2015 to improve provision of physical education (PE) and sport in primary schools. This funding - provided jointly by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport - will be allocated to primary school Head Teachers. This funding is ring-fenced and therefore can only be spent on provision of PE and sport in schools and has, on 6th February 2014, been guaranteed until 2020. More information can be found at

Purpose of funding:

Schools must spend the additional funding on improving their provision of PE and sport, but they will have the freedom to choose how they do this.

Possible uses for the funding might include:

- hiring specialist PE teachers or qualified sports coaches to work with primary teachers when teaching PE
- supporting and engaging the least active children through new or additional Change4Life clubs
- paying for professional development opportunities for teachers in PE and sport
- providing cover to release primary teachers for professional development in PE and sport
- running sport competitions, or increasing pupils' participation in the School Games
- buying quality assured professional development modules or materials for PE and sport
- providing places for pupils on after school sports clubs and holiday clubs

- pooling the additional funding with that of other local schools.

Accountability

In 2013-2014 at Mayflower, we used our money to gain the maximum possible effect so to have the biggest influence on our children's lives. So that every child had use of this money we did the following to ensure PE was embedded into life at Mayflower:

- Joined the MAP (Marine Academy Plymouth) Partnership, to share resources, enter competitions and festivals, provide staff with continuing professional development and build relationships with local schools
- Employed Stephen Coles for 15 hours per week from January 2014 to offer extended opportunities for all children in competitive events and internal school competition. To run a Year 6 Sports Leaders initiative and promote positive role-models and run Parents in PE groups to promote enjoyment in sport and physical activity not only at Mayflower but in the wider community
- Our PE Pupil Premium covered 4 specific areas - Staff Development, Curriculum Development, Healthy Lifestyles and Participation and Competition.

In 2014-2015 we have used our money to continue to form positive relationships with the MAP (Marine Academy Plymouth) Partnership and to continue developing the successes from our last academic year (£1000)

- We have employed Jenna Luiten for an additional 15 hours per week to support staff's CPD and to support the teaching our FUNdamental Skills Curriculum, Dance and Gymnastics- £7000
- Jenna will run a Games for Life club for the whole school year
- We also work very closely with Plymouth University and are investing money in staff development in FUNdamental skills training - £500
- Membership to the Youth Sports Trust - £250 - to provide PE leadership training and opportunities for KS1 and KS2 teachers to continue to develop their CPD
- Money will be used to provide cover to release our PE Leaders to observe, assess and ensure high quality PE provision throughout our school - £500
- Money will be used to ensure we can not only provide enough equipment to cover every aspect of our FUNdamental skills curriculum, but provide equipment that is going to inspire, such as Boccia - £250
- We are going to invest in video cameras to record the assessment of our FUNdamental skills curriculum and to use for competitions and children's self-assessments - £250
