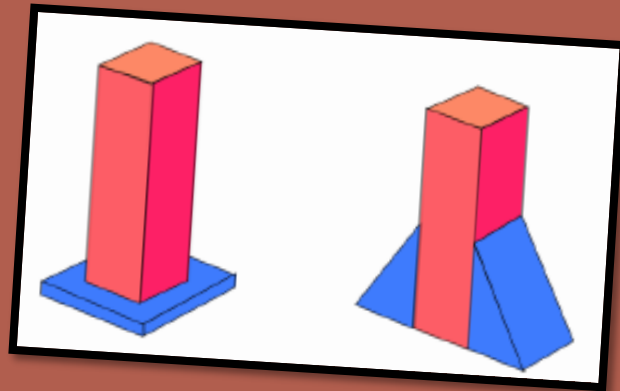
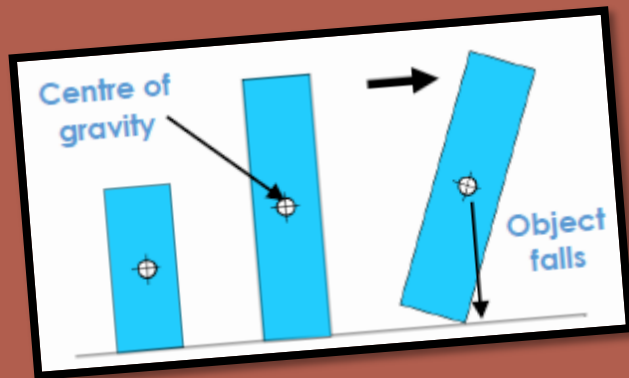
How would R. F. Scott's expedition be different today?



This term one of our driver subjects, History, will be leading us through our project on significant individuals in Plymouth. Throughout the term, we will be studying life and career of Naval Captain Robert Falcon Scott. We will focus on his *Terra Nova* expedition and the race to the Geographic South Pole.

We will also be comparing Plymouth in the Edwardian era to Plymouth today and considering how his expedition may be different today.

Designing and creating free-standing structures



Our other driver subject for the Autumn Term is Design Technology (DT). Throughout the term, we will be investigating free-standing structures - looking at how best to reinforce and strengthen structures by testing, analysing and evaluating different methods.

We will work through the process of creating design criteria and using different resources and equipment to complete our final product. We will then evaluate our product against the design brief and criteria.

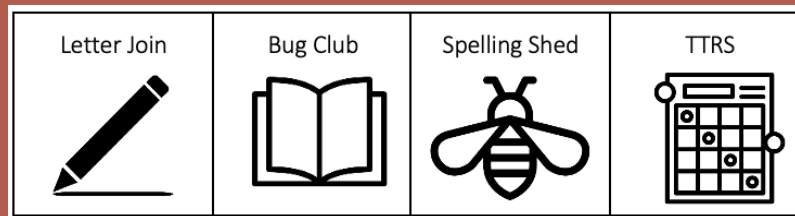
This is a project that the children really invest in - working together to build their own individual pieces.

Weekly

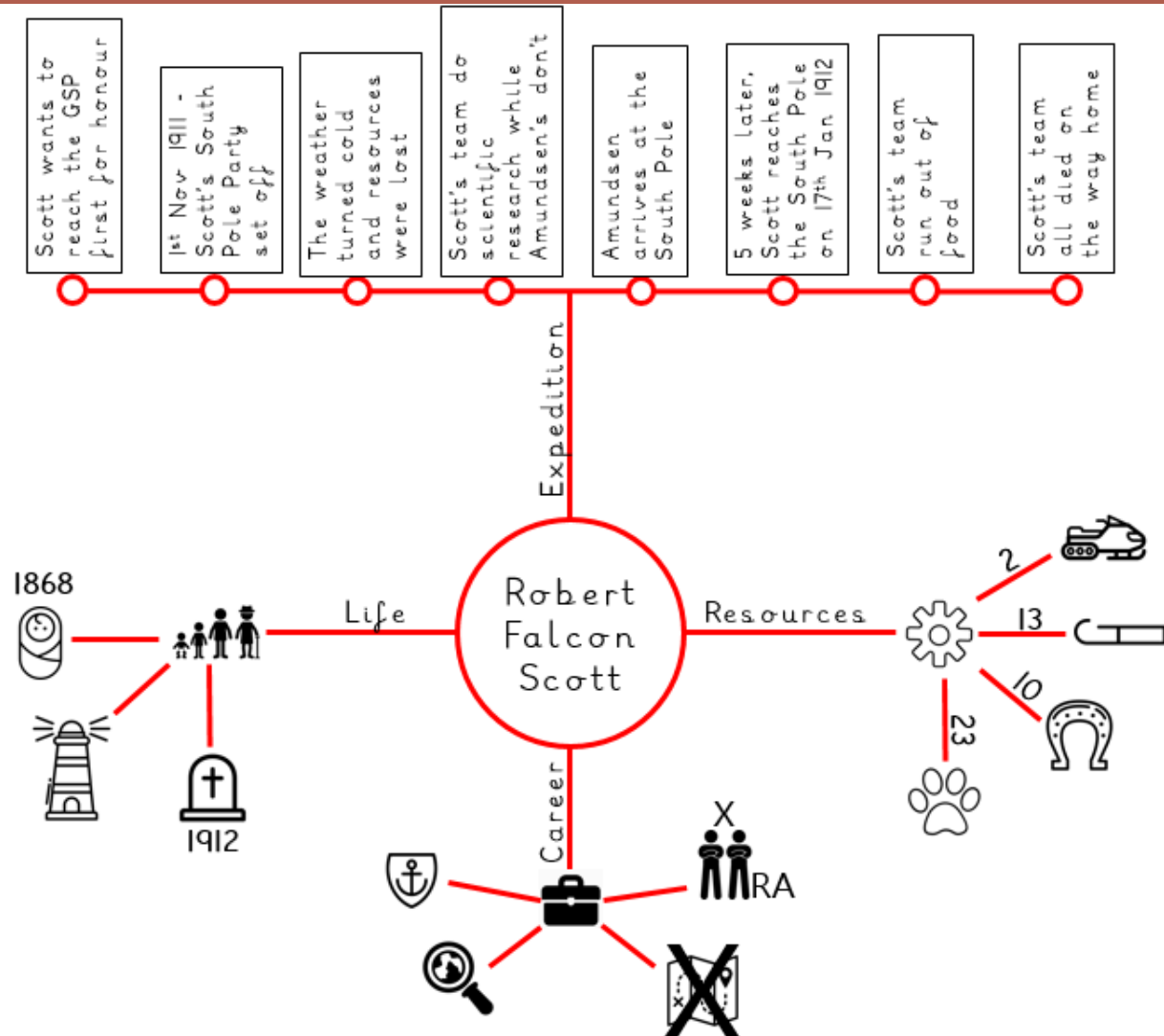
