

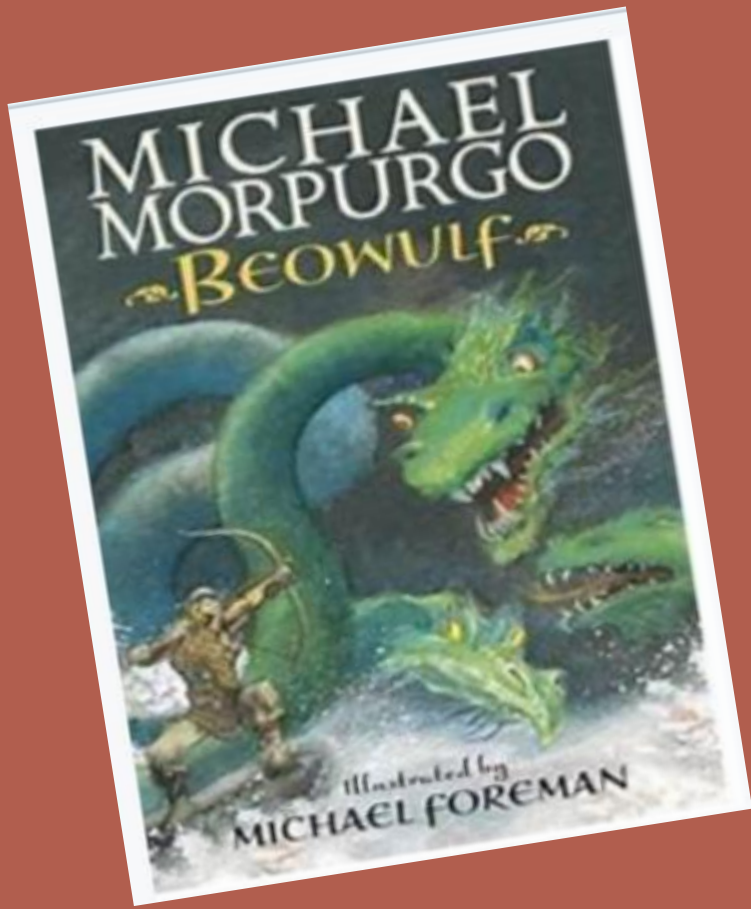

This term one of our driver subjects, History, will be leading us through our project on Vikings and Anglo Saxons. Throughout the term, we will be studying the key events, people and places, and will also be exploring the impact the Vikings and Anglo Saxons have had on life today.

We will also be comparing across historical periods by linking through the concepts of conflict and invasion.

Finally, we will be enriching our knowledge of this era with a novel by Michael Morpurgo, 'Beowulf'.

Designing and making a torch

Lantern



Traditional lanterns use kerosine or another type of fuel. Commonly used in camping.

Shake Torch



This torch is powered by magnets that when shaken create a reaction. You never need to buy a battery.

USB charging Torch



Plug in to a USB charging point. Can be expensive.

Heavy Duty Torch



Very durable and can withstand being dropped.

Headlamp Torch



Allows you to use your hands.

Work Torch



A very high quality torch used by professionals. Has a zoom feature

Our other driver subject for the Autumn Term is Design Technology (DT). Throughout the term, we will be investigating light sources – looking at the history of lighting and how lighting and torches have changed over the years.

We will work through the process of creating design criteria and using different resources and equipment to complete our final product. We will then evaluate our product against the design brief and criteria.

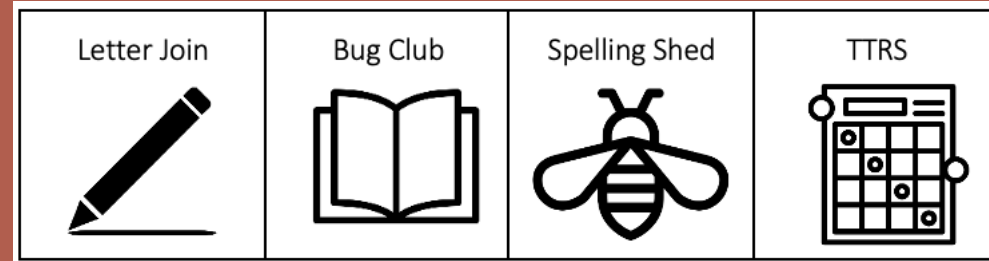
This is a project that the children really invest in – working together to build their own individual pieces.

On a weekly basis, we also encourage pupils to recall the information on their Graphic Organisers, Knowledge Organisers and Tiered Vocabulary, to somebody at home.

Termly

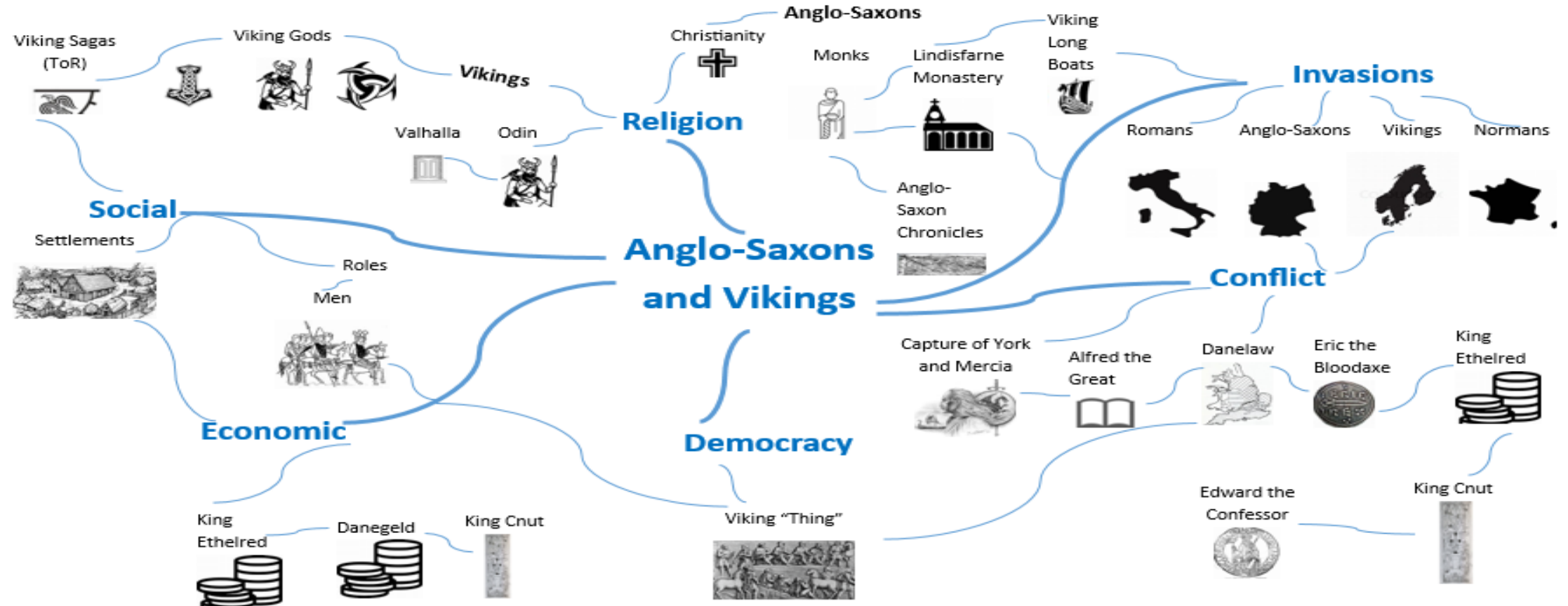

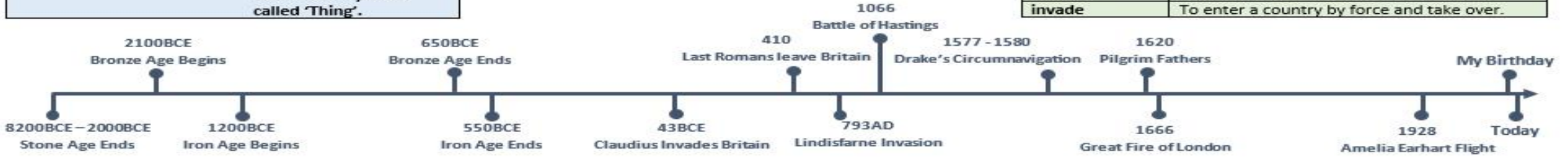

Vocabulary, People and Places

Spelling	Definition
Anglo-Saxon Chronicle.	A written account of the Viking invasions written during Alfred the Great's reign.
Edward the Confessor	One of the last Saxon kings of England, he ruled an area known as Wessex.
Eric Bloodaxe	Viking King who ruled over Jorvik and parts of Northern England. Ferocious leader.
Jorvik	The Viking name of York, the city occupied by Vikings in the 9 th and 10 th centuries.
King Ethelred	King of Saxon England, who was forced to pay Danegeld to Vikings to stop them from attacking.
Danegeld	A tax paid to the Vikings by the Saxons to stop them from invading England.
Scandinavia	Group of countries in the North of Europe.
Danelaw	Part of England that the Vikings ruled over.
Valhalla	Norse mythology said that Valhalla is a huge hall where good warriors go after death.
Alfred the Great	Saxon King who made many important changes to laws.
King Cnut	Viking King who ruled over England.
Lindisfarne	Island off of UK that once was home to a monastery that was invaded by Vikings.
conquer	To overcome and take control of a land.
invade	To enter a country by force and take over.

Invasion	The Viking Invasion of Britain	Vikings from Scandinavia attack areas of the North and overcome monasteries.
Conflict	Saxon and Viking Struggles for Power	Over many years, the Vikings and Saxons gained and lost power over the lands.
Economic	Payment of Danegeld.	The Saxon King agrees to pay the Vikings to avoid being invaded.
Religion	Vikings worship of Gods and Goddesses and afterlife.	Valhalla and the afterlife of Vikings. Ruled over by Odin and his family.
Social	Viking Way of Life	Significant influences from Scandinavian life that still has an impact on modern life.
Democracy	'Thing' rule	Vikings ruled via a council-aided democratic system called 'Thing'.
